College administration also keeps a vigilant eye on the results and needs of the students time to time.

The mentors are responsible for academic progress and psychological well being of their mentees. They are also entrusted with the task of monitoring the attendance and academic progress of the students. They also provide primary psychological counselling of those who need them and refer them for more professional counselling, if required. At the beginning of the academic session, the mentors conduct orientation programmes for the mentees, whereby they are acquainted with the institution, its goals and mission, the facilities available and the regulations of the affiliating university. The mentors maintain the biographic details of each individual mentee including educational background and socioeconomic status.
